EMPLOYMENT (MINIMUM WAGES) (WET CARGO AND DRY CARGO TRUCK DRIVERS) ORDER, 2020

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 54 of the Employment Act, I, KEN EDWARD KANDODO, Minister of Labour, in consultation with relevant organizations of employers and employees, make the following Order—

1. This Order may be cited as the Employment Act (Minimum Wages) (Wet Cargo and Dry Cargo Truck Drivers) Order, 2020 and shall come into operation on 1st January, 2021. Citation and commencement
2. The minimum wages in respect of Wet Cargo and Dry Cargo Truck Drivers shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto. Minimum wages for Wet Cargo and Dry Cargo Truck Drivers

EMPLOYMENT (MINIMUM WAGES) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 2020

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 54 of the Employment Act, I, KEN EDWARD KANDODO, Minister of Labour, in consultation with relevant organizations of employers and employees, make the following Order—

- Citation and commencement 1. This Order may be cited as the Employment Act (Minimum Wages) (Amendment) Order, 2020 and shall come into operation on 1st January, 2021.
- Amendment of Cap. 55:01 GN. 68 of 2019 2. The Employment (Minimum Wages) Order is amended in paragraph 2 (1) by—
 (a) deleting the figure “K1,346.26” in subparagraph (a) and substitute therefor the figure “K1,923.08”; and
 (b) deleting the figure “K1,346.26” in subparagraph (b) and substitute therefor the figure “K1,923.08”.
- Insertion of new paragraph 3 into the principal Order 3. The principal Order is amended by inserting immediately after paragraph 2, the following new paragraph 3 as follows—
 “Wages for a domestic worker 3. The minimum wages for a domestic worker shall be K1,461.54 per day.”

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 44 of the Political Parties Act, I, TITUS EDWARD SONGISO MVALO, Minister of Justice, make the following Regulations—

- Citation 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Political Parties (Forms and Fees) Regulations, 2020.
- Forms 2. The Forms set out in the First Schedule shall be used for purposes of the Act, and the particulars contained in the Forms and not particularly prescribed by the Act are hereby prescribed as particulars required under the Act.
- Fees 3. The fees set out in the Second Schedule shall be payable to the Registrar in respect of the matters to which they relate.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT

(Cap. 34:01)

PUBLIC HEALTH (CORONA VIRUS AND COVID-19) (PREVENTION, CONTAINMENT AND MANAGEMENT) (AMENDMENT) (NO.3) RULES, 2020

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 31 as read with section 29 of the Public Health Act, I, KHUMBIZE KANDOODO CHIPONDA, Minister of Health, make the following Rules—

- Citation 1. These Rules may be cited as the Public Health (Corona Virus and COVID-19) (Prevention, Containment and Management) (Amendment) (No. 3) Rules, 2020.
- Amendment of r.2 to Cap.34:01 Sub. leg. G.N.48/2020 2. The Public Health (Corona Virus and COVID-19) (Prevention, Containment and Management) Rules, 2020 (hereinafter referred to as the “principal Rules”) are amended, in rule 2, by inserting, in the correct alphabetical order, the following new definition—
“gathering” means an assembly, concourse or procession of more than one hundred persons, whether wholly or partially in open air or in a building;”.
- Insertion of r.11 into the principal Rules 3. The principal Rules are amended, by inserting immediately after rule 10, a new rule 11 as follows—
“Regulation of gatherings 11.—(1) All gatherings are hereby prohibited, subject to the exceptions provided in this rule.
(2) Subrule (1) shall not apply to—
(a) a meeting of the National Assembly; and
(b) a meeting convened to discuss COVID-19 interventions.
(3) A gathering referred to in subrule (2) shall comply with all the preventive measures prescribed under rule 3(1).
(4) An enforcement officer may order a gathering to disperse and may use reasonable force to cause the gathering to disperse.
(5) A person who contravenes this rule, commits an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine of one hundred thousand Kwacha and to imprisonment for three months.”.
- Revocation of G.N. 91/2020 4. The Public Health (Corona Virus and COVID-19) (Prevention, Containment and Management) (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules, 2020 are revoked.
